

AGILE APPROACH TO MSP



MSP DIRECTIVE

Maritime spatial planning should cover the full cycle of problem and opportunity identification, information collection, planning, decision-making, implementation, **revision or updating**, and the monitoring of implementation, and should have due regard to land-sea interactions and best available knowledge.

MSP DIRECTIVE

Maritime spatial plans shall be reviewed by **Member States** as decided by them but at least every ten years.

As **part of the planning and management process**, Member States bordering marine waters **shall cooperate** with the aim of ensuring that maritime spatial plans are coherent and coordinated across the marine region concerned. Such cooperation shall take into account, in particular, issues of a transnational nature.

MSP DIRECTIVE

Member States shall send copies of the maritime spatial plans, including relevant existing explanatory material on the implementation of this Directive, and all subsequent updates, to the Commission and to any other Member States concerned within three months of their publication.
