#### What do we know (Danish context)

- Bigger groupsize
- Longer visits (time)
- More frequent public transportation
- Fewer, and less frequent visits (forests and areas outside cities)
- Higher fear of meeting dangerous animals
- Socialising food.
- Prefer urban green spaces (Adolescents use these on almost daily basis).

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#### Societal and Political context

- Ethnicity country of origin
- Policy approach integration (labour, education)
- Natural areas not seen as ressource for integration – only few spread approaches.
- No specific mentioning of access of ethnic minorites in legislation natural areas.
- Research mainly descriptive

### Outdoor recreation policy (2015)

"All groups should have the possibility to use nature – and have benefit of it. Also the vulnerable groups" (Ministry of the Environment, 2015)

It could be argued...

**Deprived groups** – yes they have the opportunity, but do they also have the knowledge to use their opportunity?

**Groups with limited experiences** with natural areas – e.g. refugees, asylum seekers, immigrants?









#### Stakeholders - NGO's

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- Democratic memberorganisation
- 210 local departments
- Runs asylum centers in Denmark
- 25.000 volunteers engaged in different kinds of vounteer projects i.e. refugees, elderly and vulnerable people.

- Examples of social activities and gardening projects several places.








#### NGO's – Venligboerne The people's network



- Familieklubber (Family clubs – Social housing areas) nature-activities are provided
- Project "You laugh with your entire body", nature-based programme for traumatised refugees and their families.

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#### **Nature Agency**

- Collaboration between municipality and Nature Agency on integration.
- Includes nature (eg. Invasive species, nature preservation etc.) in activities
- Supplements municipalities' integration programme "ready to work"







#### Naturven (Nature based integration)

- Danish Refugee Council
   & Forest and Landscape
   College, UCPH.
- 5 municipalities,
- Nature interested refugees/immigrants and integration-interested "nature-loving" ethnic Danes
- Budget 1.2 mill. Dkr.
   Includes funding for eg.
   equipment
