### Recent developments in CLRTAP

# Three latest Protocols - from negotiation to implementation (LTS)

- Protocol on HM: December 2012
  - New emission limit values and extended emission source categories
  - Flexibilities for new Parties
- Protocol on Persistent Organic Pollutants: 2009
  - o Addition of new substances
- Protocol to abate Acidification, Eutrophication, Ground-level Ozone (Gothenburg Protocol, GP): May 2012
  - o see next slide



### **Amendments to the Gothenburg Protocol**

- adopted by the 31. EB Meeting, May 2012
- National emission reduction targets for 2020 and beyond compared to 2005 base year:  $SO_x$ ,  $NO_x$ ,  $NH_3$ , VOC and for the first time PM 2.5 (inc. black carbon)
- Flexibilities to encourage accession by EECCA countries
- $\bullet$  Guidance document (GD) on health and environmental improvements using new knowledge, methods and data, adopted at  $32^{nd}$  session of the EB (2013) as the  $5^{th}$  GD to GP





### **Amendments to the Gothenburg Protocol (GP)**

Guidance document on health and environmental improvements using new knowledge, methods and data

**Objective:** Compare effects of emission reduction commitments in 2020 in relation to the base year 2005

- o for countries within the geographical scope of EMEP
- o eleven selected indicators:

— Health: mortality (PM 2.5, ozone), morbidity (ozone)

Environment: acidification, eutrophication (% area at risk, AAE-Average Accumulated

Exceedance),

Biodiversity: species richness in grassland

Crop damage: wheat yield reduction due to ground level ozone

- Damage to materials: corrosion and soiling





### **Spotlights: Other recent developments in CLRTAP**

- The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (fYROM) to join the the GP (proposal accepted by EB), Montenegro request still pending
- New Parties to the **EMEP Protocol**: **Georgia, Albania, fYROM, Armenia** (Moldova in 2014?)
- EMEP: Updated Guidelines for reporting emission data under CLRTAP
- New sequence of meetings
- Action Plan for EECCA countries: projects, assistance, workshops, financial issues, discussion on needs / support of EECCA countries
- National reporting (exchange of experience) in main bodies (EMEP, WGE, WGSR)

# Assessment Report 2015/16 (ECE/EB.AIR/122, item 27.) on the Convention's achievements and future prospects

- **Objective**: state of the art document for experts, Parties and scientists
- Draft <u>Outline</u> presented at 32 EB by chairs of EB, WGSR, EMEP SB and WGE (informal doc. No 13)
- ... discussed and updated at the Bureau meetings in March 2014. A list of policy questions to be answered was drafted
- discussion on the content and outline still ongoing (by summer 2014?)
- final outline and organisation of work to be discussed at the meetings of WGSR, EMEP, WGE later this year
- **Funding** from EMEP and effects-related activities + funding by Parties.

#### The WGE

... recommended seeking further guidance from the EB on information required so that effects-based indicators could be of greater use in the future development of effects-based scenarios and related policy support, in accordance with the LTS (EB decision 2010/18, annex).

# III. Recent results and updating of scientific and technical knowledge

The WGE took note of the results from its subsidiary programmes and i.a.

- requested ICP Forests to provide their results on CL and background data to ICP M&M for potential inclusion in the European CL database
- noted ICP Waters' results, that biodiversity in rivers and lakes was increasing in 5 countries and was likely associated with chemical recovery
- Encouraged ICP Materials to continue ist plan for issuing a call for data on inventory and condition of stock materials at UNESCO cultural heritage sites
- Noted ICP Vegetation's results and decided to forward the report on moss survey and on the benefits of AP control for biodiversity and ES as official documents to EB

# III. Recent results and updating of scientific and technical knowledge

The WGE took note of the results from its subsidiary programmes and i.a.

- took note of the work of **ICP IM**, in particular its work on priority work items (biodiversity indicators, CL, ...). It noted the identified increasing risk of HM for biological systems and the negative impacts of N on biodiversity
- invited **ICP M&M** to update the CL Manual and make in available on the CLRTAP website, requested CCE to check with NFCs the use of the European background database in effects assessements
- Noted the results of **TF Health**, e.g. its work for the revision of EU air quality legislation
- took note of the significant progess in model development supported by the JEG

#### IV Further development of the effects-oriented activities:

- Impact assessment in the context of hemispheric transport of air pollution: increase cooperation WGE TF HTAP
- Joint Session with EMEP SB:
- Presentations on: Saltsjöbaden V / GAINS and IAM / the draft guidance document to GP, atmospheric modelling of HM, POPs, PM and O<sub>3</sub> relevant for effects work, benefits of AP control for biodiversity and ES, past and planned assessment reports by EMEP and WGE
- o Discussion on common issues of WGE and EMEP: continue organising joint workshops and produce joint reports aimed at national and international policy makers

#### V Information on the review of the ICPs

The WGE provided comments and recommendations to the draft report.

The workplan 2014/15 (item 1.8) considers tasks to improve the functioning of the WGE and EMEP groups:

- foster integrated/thematic assessments
- o common standards for all ICPs; portal approach to improve data access via the web
- o explore ways to combine/merge activities of some ICPs, joint reporting and meetings
- o explore a more stable long-term funding mechanism for effects related activities
