





### **Conclusions**

- Cities are working with a variety of planning instruments rather than a single overarching strategy
- Changes are rather incremental than radical transformative
- High-level policy support is needed for fundamental transformations
- Financial and human resources are needed for more ambitious green space planning
- Only few cities are well prepared for co-creative strategies
