



All Youth Want To Rule Their World Research Project 2018–2023





Solutions for youth participation and sustainable well-being

ALL-YOUTH – All youth want to rule their world is a multidisciplinary research project which explores the capacities of young people (aged between 16 and 25) and the obstacles that hamper their engagement with society. We also explore the visions of youth regarding sustainable future, growth and well-being.

Our key ideas for sustainable growth are responsive governance and rule of law, digital innovation and sustainable wellbeing.

ALL-YOUTH project will be implemented in co-operation with **Helsinki University**, **University of Tampere**, and **University of Eastern Finland**.

The project is funded by the **Strategic Research Council** (SRC) which provides funding for long-term and programme-based research aimed at finding solutions to the major challenges facing Finnish society.





Main themes of subprojects

- Equal facilities and accessibility
- Young people's wishes and dreams for sustainable development and well-being
- Innovative digital models and services developed with young people
- Legal obstacles to youth participation in the legislative process and the impact assessment of legislation
- Sustainable well-being and young people's employment opportunities in sustainable development e.g. in the circular based bioeconomy







THE CIRCULAR KNOWLEDGEMODEL TIETO KIERTOON-MALLI – FOR WHOM?

THE MODEL IS DIRECTED AT YOUNG PEOPLE, BETWEEN THE AGES OF 15 AND 30, WHO ARE INTERESTED IN THE ENVIRONMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCACY, AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT. THE AIM OF THE MODEL IS FIRST AND FOREMOST TO REACH OUT TO YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ARE IN DIFFERENT EDUCATIONAL TRANSITION PHASES AND ARE STILL LOOKING FOR THEIR STUDY OR WORK PATHS.

RELIABLE ADULTS, WHO WISH TO HELP YOUNG PEOPLE, WORK AS VOLUNTEERS IN THE MODEL. THE CIRCULAR KNOWLEDGE MODEL HAS BEEN DESIGNED TO ACT AS A FORM OF VOLUNTEER WORK BASED ON OPENNESS, MUTUAL COMMITMENT AND TRUST. IN ADDITION, SHARING KNOWLEDGE CAN FOSTER COMMUNALITY AS WELL AS EMOTIONAL AND SOCIAL WELL-BEING. BY RECOGNIZING AND STRENGTHENING THE ABILITIES OF YOUNG PEOPLE, WE CAN OFFER THEM OPPORTUNITIES TO MAKE PRO-ENVIRONMENTAL CHOICES AND ACTS TOWARDS MORE SUSTAINABLE WELL-BEING.
